Duties and responsibilities

Responsible for maintaining transportation fleet. As a Transportation Mechanic, one will be responsible for providing assistance to the Lead Mechanic. Additionally, the Transportation Mechanic will perform preventative and corrective maintenance on Washington County Board of Education buses or any other vehicles.

- Performs preventative maintenance on Washington County Board of Education vehicles.
- Performs corrective maintenance on Washington County Board of Education vehicles.
- Maintains good housekeeping in the shop area.
- Secures all tools and equipment in the shop.
- Always wear or use proper protective equipment.
- Performs all other duties as deemed appropriate by the Director of Facilities and/or Lead Transportation Mechanic.

Qualifications

- Have a Valid CDL or have the ability to obtain one

Physical requirements

- Indoor/outdoor environment subject to changing temperatures exceeding 90 degrees at times.
- Subject to regular exposure to fumes, dust and odor, vehicle exhaust, dirt, oil, grease, and noise from equipment operation.
- Work around and with machinery and motorized equipment.
- Work in a shop.
- Changing priorities and interruptions.
- Sitting, standing, and walking for extended periods of time. Lifting, carrying, pushing, and pulling object(s) weighing up to 75 pounds.
- Manipulate hands and fingers to operate a variety of specialized tools and equipment. Reach overhead, the shoulder and horizontally to reach and place materials and equipment in certain areas.
- Occasional bending, kneeling, crouching, turning and twisting.
- Occasional carrying, pushing, or pulling boxes and engines.
- Crawling under vehicles.
- Clarity of vision at varying distances to observe diagnostic instruments, manuals, and other printed information.
- Verbal, auditory, and written capabilities to effectively communicate in an articulate manner.
- Perform physically demanding work.
- May require driving a vehicle to conduct work. Hazards
- Working with tools, and powered machinery.
